

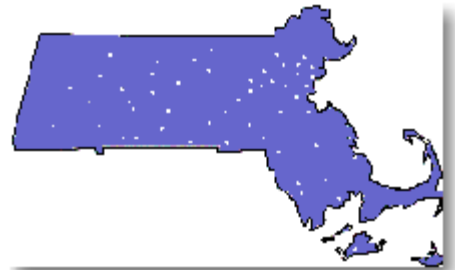

The DASPP is a privately funded initiative. Its mission is to support public schools, districts and educational collaboratives in Massachusetts in their efforts to utilize information regarding student performance related to the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) and other educational reforms.



DASPP Objectives

Working towards its mission, project staff are committed to:

- ♦ designing and implementing initiatives that target locally identified priority needs.
- ♦ providing local schools, districts, and collaboratives with information enabling them to focus their efforts on reflective decision-making.
- ♦ providing assistance in the areas of strategic planning; district and school-based improvement planning; development of formative and summative assessment measures; implications to curriculum, instruction, and assessment practices; professional development; specialized research; and information dissemination.
- ♦ assisting schools, districts, and educational collaboratives with the dissemination of information.
- ♦ encouraging the sharing of best practices among schools, districts, and educational collaboratives facing similar challenges.

Project Activities

Undertaken During 2005-2006

During the past school year, DASPP staff partnered with over 65 schools, districts, and educational collaboratives in Massachusetts. Included in this total were those at both the local and regional level (including vocational technical high schools) involved in a range of targeted data-driven initiatives.

Collaboration Opportunities

During the upcoming school year, DASPP will once again partner with a limited number of public schools, districts, and educational collaboratives throughout Massachusetts.

Project Staff

The DASPP staff is composed of a core group of university and school-based individuals with expertise and successful experience working with schools, districts, and educational collaboratives in varied disciplines, grade levels, and research areas. Since each partnership is designed to meet the needs of that particular organization, often the 'mix' of staff working on each initiative will vary with the project's targeted assistance.

Project Funding

During the 2005-2006 school year, matching funds (up to 60%) were awarded to selected schools, districts, and educational collaboratives in support of project staff and their work assisting each to address locally targeted needs. The project's funding for the 2006-2007 school year has been secured.
